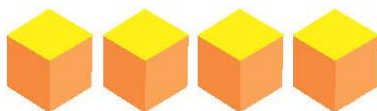
It's the Law

The State passed two laws that makes it mandatory for businesses, institutions and multi-family complexes to separate recyclables and organics/compostables from their trash. This includes yard waste, food waste and food-soiled paper.

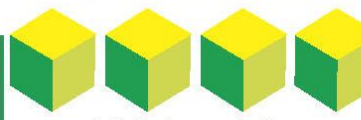
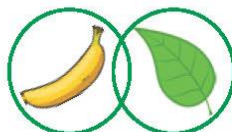
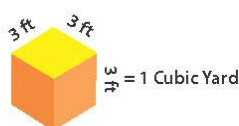
AB 341

MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING LAW

AB 341 requires multi-family complexes and businesses that generate 4 cubic yards or more of trash per week to arrange for recycling services.



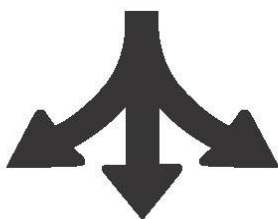
4 Cubic Yards
